# **About the Director**

My name is Tumelo Lekena. I am a South African Writer and Director. A lover of movies since the age of eight, I began taking writing seriously in high school, constantly writing stories on exercise books until I discovered screenwriting in 2012. Born and raised in Durban, South Africa, in 2018 I left my cooperate job and moved to Cape Town where I received a scholarship to study at Big Fish Digital School of Filmmaking for 2 years. A month later after graduation, I landed my first job as a casting director for several months casting for commercials. It was here that I honed my directing skills, and I was inspired write my first short film, Father's Day. The film received funding from three organizations, KwaZuluNatal film Commission, National Film and Video Foundation and Economic Development, Tourism and Environmental Affairs.

# **Director's statement**

Father's Day is a personal story. Growing up, I only saw my father (Rest in Peace) on weekends or school holidays until my late twenties. The inspiration for this film stems from my years of experience running children's classes. There was a 12-year-old boy who was raised by a single mother and grandmother. One day after a class his grandmother came up to me and said that her grandson looks up to me as a father figure. This was flattering but also thought provoking, and I wondered what happens when this boy's father is needed at school! I took the feel that arose within me and coupled it with the experience of my life with my brothers. For me, when my dad was at work my mom was our father.
